Dear Parents and Guardians.

Last term I was nominated for the Telstra Business Women's Award category "Public Sector and Academia". The award process progresses through several stages and I have reached the stage as an NT finalist. Winners will be announced this Friday at the awards evening. I feel very honoured to be nominated and it has allowed me time to reflect on my journey in the NT education system over the past 32 years.

Staff and students are very excited about the whole school concert "Under The Big Top". Our previous three productions at the Darwin Entertainment Centre (DEC) have been sensational. "Under The Big Top" will be at DEC on Friday 24th November at 7pm. This is Friday Week 7 this term. More information will be sent home outlining times for students to arrive, meeting areas, footwear, etc. Tickets can be purchased either online www.yourcentre.com.au or from the DEC Box Office. \$30 adult and \$12 child or concession holders. There is no charge for Larrakeyah Primary students who will be performing. As the concert is "out of normal school hours", Larrakeyah Primary students can only attend if they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Any Larrakeyah Primary students attending who are not participating in the Performance must be seated with their parents and a ticket needs to be purchased for them.

A reminder to all parents about the Drop-Off-Zone at the front of the school, particularly our new families. We have very clear signs and yellow lines that indicate **No Parking** in this zone. The Drop-Off-Zone is designed as a quick drop-off and pick-up area to keep traffic flowing to avoid congestion. In the interest of student safety and courtesy to other drivers, please continue to remember the following:

Do not park in the Drop-Off-Zone. If you have to get out of the car to escort your children into the school (including preschool) or come to the front office, please find a carpark.

Move as far along as possible before dropping off your children as this allows other cars to move in behind you. Do not stay in the middle of the carpark to drop off your children. This is very dangerous for children and obstructs cars moving out of the Drop-Off-Zone.

Students are excited about the new playground equipment in the middle/upper area. This new equipment has replaced the old equipment that was removed with the construction of the new building. Thank you to Larrakeyah Primary School Board, particularly Rachita Jain, in following through with this major project.

We have an increasing number of students playing in the school grounds after school instead of going home after the school bell. Once dismissed, children are to walk/ride home, attend our Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) program or wait for parents to be collected from school. Parents need to be punctual in collecting their child – school finishes at 2.45pm. We have a duty of care to ensure that students are going home once they are dismissed. OSHC also needs to abide by national regulations and it has become difficult for OSHC staff to supervise students in their care when there are other students remaining in the school grounds. Staff will be ensuring that students are going home after the bell at 2.45pm. Regards,








We have a feedback wall where Mrs Telley provides feedback to us about our writing. This helps us to understand what we are doing well in our writing and where we need to improve.


