In response to the Stranger Danger incident last Term, we would like to update you on the actions that have been taken by the school during this time:

- All teachers have spoken with their classes regarding 'Stranger Danger' and the strategies to use- 'Recognise, React and Report'.
- Teachers are being vigilant in and around the school grounds.
- 2 officers from Community and Youth Engagement have addressed the whole school assembly to reiterate the 'Recognise, React and Report' message from teachers.
- We have requested that police conduct extra patrols in the neighborhood, particularly at the start and end of the school day.
- Mobile Camera Unit has been installed near the school for a period of time.

### Friday 2 November 2018



## VARIETY OF PRONOUNS

### **Learning Intention:**

Students learn about the variety of pronouns.

### Success Criteria:

Students can identify when to replace a noun with a pronoun.

Students successfully replace nouns with pronouns in their writing.

### Lesson Sequence:

- Students watched an engaging video introducing the topic on pronouns.
- The whole class discussed what pronouns are and how they are used to enhance writing. Together, we brainstormed and listed examples on the whiteboard of pronouns that could replace nouns, and vice versa.
- Students formed small groups and worked collaboratively to create 'pronoun flowers' to represent the relationship between specific nouns and pronouns.
- Students shared their work with their peers and discussed whether one
  of the nouns they wrote was possessive, demonstrative, objective,
  subjective, reflexive or indefinite.
- Students chose one of their own texts and improved it with the careful use of pronouns.





Learning Intention: We are learning to write accurately about historical events by putting ourselves into another person's shoes
