Dear Parents and Guardians,

Larrakeyah Primary has high expectations, high standards and high achievement. Our school is identified in NAPLAN testing as a school performing better than the national average. This is in all areas of literacy and numeracy. Our school improvement agenda this year focusses on Writing, Mathematics and using data to inform teaching. We have a video on our school website that clearly outlines the school's improvement agenda. We have teaching expectations specific to our school which include explicit teaching, high expectations, engaged learning, an intentionally inviting environment and implementing Visible Learning.

I, and the Assistant Principals, Mr Collister and Mrs Guse, regularly spend time in classrooms observing lessons. This not only allows us to observe teaching and learning across the school, but enables us to give feedback to teachers. Teacher feedback is important so that we can continually improve the quality of teaching to improve student learning outcomes. Teachers also observe and give feedback to their colleagues in the areas of Visible Learning and Writing.

This year we are also focussing on 21st century learning and the essential skills that students need for the future – creativity, collaboration, communication and critical thinking. We refer to these skills as the 4 C's and teachers are also learning of the importance of focussing on these skills in their teaching. We are conscious of preparing our students well for the future workforce.



WRITING FOCUS 1/2 ZIKOS






Learning Intention:

- ↓ I can read my work and ensure it makes sense.



















Visible Learning with 6 Marschall

In 6 Marschall Maths we are working on our basic number facts, mental maths strategies and order of operations rules to prepare us for a year of tricky Year 6 mathematical equations! We are currently looking at BODMAS and are enjoying problem solving our way to success by using collaborative and critical thinking skills. Our task here was to use the correct order of operations with a set of numbers to create four in a row. It was a fast and fierce competition with all students tasting success. Go 6 Mar!

Learning Intention:

We are learning to correctly use the BODMAS order of operations rules.

Success Criteria:

I have solved 4-IN-A-ROW before my partner in an online problem solving game.







This week we have followed up our trellis building with a review of our garden beds. Students were delighted to see their hard work being paid off with seedlings emerging in most of the garden beds. The students recorded the height, number of leaves and number of seedlings present in their garden bed.

As part of the lesson today we also conducted a science investigation into how the stem works. Students were asked to make predictions about what changes they might be able to see if a stick of leafy celery were left overnight in some coloured water and give reasons for their hypothesis. I was very impressed with the students reasoning skills. It was fantastic to witness their sense of discovery too, when they examined and dissected the prepared celery to ascertain how the xylem (veins) in the stem worked.
