
<u>Literacy and Numeracy Tutoring Program – Term 2</u>

Larrakeyah Primary School offers a Literacy and Numeracy Tutoring Program. Tutoring sessions fall into two categories: Literacy and Numeracy. One hour sessions will be available for students in Years 2-6.

Tutoring sessions will be limited to a minimum of 2 students and a maximum of 5 students to ensure each student receives individual support from the tutors.

This is an afterschool program that will run for 8 weeks and costs \$320. Weekly sessions

will commence **Term 2, Week 2, Monday 30th April (3:00 pm – 4:00 pm)** and continue for 8 weeks, with the final sessions beginning on **Monday 18th June**.



Registration for Term 2 tutoring is now open and closes on **Wednesday 11th April**. Registration forms have been sent

home, if you haven't received one please contact the front office. Payment is not required until you have received a confirmation letter, which will come out in Term 2.



To register for the Extra-Curricular Activity program you will need to go On-Line. If you do not have access to a computer there is one in the School Office available to be used or, alternatively, you can email the ECA Coordinator, Rick Collister (<u>rick.collister@ntschools.net</u>).

Registration Procedures are:

Online: go to <u>www.schoolinterviews.com.au</u> and type in the code **cy66r** and enter your information. You will only need to put in your No. 1 preference. If the student limit for the activity is reached you will have to select your second preference. Bookings are open now and close on **Sunday April 1 at 5pm.**

Email: send an email to **rick.collister@ntschools.net**. Email registration closes **Sunday**, **April 1**, **at 5pm**. You will need to give the following information: a) your child/children's name/s. The activity/ies you would like them to take part in.

The Online method is the recommended one to use.

Important Notes and Conditions for Parents

- Enrolment is on a first-in, first-served basis. Confirmation of Enrolment is sent out when your registration is done on the School Interviews website. Payment details will also be on the Confirmation letter.
- Where possible all students get their first choice. **On-line enrolment**: if your first choice option is full then you need to select another option. **Email**: these registrations are immediately transferred to the online booking form. The On-line enrolment option is the best option to use to get your choice because you know immediately if there is a place available.
- If you miss out on your first choice because the activity is full you can select a 2nd choice and then send an email requesting to be waitlisted for the first choice activity.
- Each activity needs a minimum number of students enrolled for it to commence. The minimum for each activity often varies but is usually 10 students. If, when enrolments close, an activity does not reach the minimum number of students you will be contacted and have the opportunity to enrol in another activity, if there is space available.
- Weekly sessions will commence Term 2, Week 2, Wednesday 2nd May, 2018 (3pm 4pm) and continue for 8 weeks, finishing on Wednesday 20th June, 2018
- Payment is due upon receipt of Confirmation of Enrolment and by Friday 6th April, 2018 to guarantee a place in the activity. If payment is not made by that date the place in the activity will go to someone on the waitlist.
- If you are paying through Direct Debit, please indicate which activity you are paying for.
- ECAs will be invoiced in full and cannot be pro-rated. Refunds will only be offered for a change of mind within the first week of the program.
- Payment is only required when you have received notification of the offer of a place in an activity.
- It is a parent's responsibility to organise suitable transport home from school at the completion of the activity. Parents must pick up their child at the end of the ECA session or notify the school of alternative arrangements for your child to be collected from outside the school office. If your child attends OSHC the instructor/teacher will direct them to OSHC. If your child is not being collected by yourself, or another adult, a note must be sent to school explaining how your child will be getting home (e.g. walking, catching a bus, riding a bike). In the event your child is consistently late being collected (3 times without notification) then they will be asked to stop attending the ECA Program.
- If a session is cancelled, a make-up session will be arranged at a later date and parents will be notified.
- Once students have enrolled in an ECA, their attendance each week is compulsory. During the term, if they are absent from the ECA on 3 or more occasions without an explanation they will be deemed as having withdrawn from the activity.
- Parents must indicate upon registration the method of collection for their child (whether they
 walk home, will be picked up from the venue, go to OSHC, etc)
- If a student is absent for a session there will be no refunds or make up sessions unless the absence is due to a school activity.
- Registering for an activity indicates acceptance of these Conditions.

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• <u>NT Government Sport Vouchers</u> can only be used towards payment of the Tennis activity. If you are intending to use this voucher for an ECA activity you must pay any difference by the due date.
