














Last week 20 girls participated in the AFL NT



We have learnt to say 'xie xie' from China, 'dhanyavaad' from India, Nepal and Bangladesh, 'arigato' from Japan, 'obrigado' from Portugal, 'go raibh maith agat' from Ireland, 'efcharistó' from Greece, 'merci' from France, 'danke' from Germany, 'Jay Zoo Thin Par Del' from Burma, 'khob khum ka' from Thailand, and 'salamat' from the Philippines just to name a few.

We have tasted dumplings, putu, idli, gulab jamun, waffles, lamingtons, sausage rolls, anzac biscuits, sticky rice, fried rice, sushi, chicken satays, empanadas and arepas, kangaroo tails and roasted yams, hot dogs, apple pie and cream, soada bread and potato cakes, and Christmas biscuits, plus more.












### Visible Learning with 3 Needham

### Writing Focus in 2 Korfias


Good writers have traits. Sentence fluency is the trait that we listen for. It is hearing the rhythm and flow of the written language. In good writing, sentences should vary in length and structure allowing the reader to add expression while reading what has been written. The author uses clear sentences that make sense. Sentences should also flow smoothly to show how ideas relate.

What colours will be used on your memorial? Why?


