The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual assessment program for schools since 2008. Next Tuesday 14, Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 May, students will undertake the 2019 NAPLAN tests. NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four domains of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how individual students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australian children.

Professional Development Day for Teachers – Friday 24 May

Friday 24th May is a professional development day for teachers. Teachers will be engaged in professional development sessions on Writing, Assessment, ESL learners, Cambridge Curriculum and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics). Teachers across Darwin City primary schools will also be working together to discuss how they use data to inform teaching. This is important in our ongoing striving for improvement in teaching and learning. This professional learning day has been approved by

Larrakeyah Primary School Board and the Department of Education. Please note: this is a student free day and parents are requested to make alternative arrangements for the care of their children on this day. Our OSHC Director, Ilias Hourdas, is offering a Vacation Care program on this day. He will need to know as soon as possible if you need to book a place for your child. 



Save the Date – An Evening of Stargazing Tuesday May 14th

ANU superstar Astrophysicist Dr Brad Tucker will visit Darwin High to talk about the Universe and the future of space followed by an evening of stargazing with the audience. In the past few decades, rapid progress in technology has led to a complete change in our view of the Universe. In the next few decades, this will change even more as we become an inter-planetary species. Dr Brad Tucker will talk about some of these discoveries, from planets around other stars, to exploring the Universe and maybe even visiting other planets, and show we are now turning science fiction into reality.

Dr Brad Tucker is an Astrophysicist/Cosmologist, and currently a Research Fellow at the Research School of Astronomy and Astrophysics, Mt. Stromlo Observatory and the National Centre for the Public Awareness of Science at ANU. Brad received Bachelor's degrees in Physics, Philosophy, and Theology from the University of Notre Dame. He then undertook a PhD at Mt. Stromlo Observatory at the Australian National University. He is currently working on projects trying to discover the true nature of dark energy, the mysterious substance causing the accelerating expansion of the Universe, which makes up 70% of the Universe. He's one of the leads of the Kepler Extra-Galactic Survey, a Kepler Space Telescope Key Program, to understand why and how stars blow up. He is also leading a project to build a network of ultraviolet telescopes in the upper atmosphere, which are being built at Mt. Stromlo, a search to find Planet 9 - a hypothetical new planet on the edges of our Solar System, as well as a new mission to capture and mine an asteroid.

Stargazing with Dr Tucker will take place after the event outside on oval at Darwin High School. Feel free to bring your own telescope to stargaze.


