News from the School Board

The Larrakeyah Primary School Board met on Monday, with a focus on traffic issues in the vicinity of the school.

The Darwin City Council has decreed that the Larrakeyah Naval Base entry will be returned to Packard Street for as much of the Larrakeyah Barracks Redevelopment Project as possible. The School Board is extremely concerned for the safety of students should they implement the currently planned measures. In addition to the reintroduction of two way traffic on Packard Street, the City of Darwin is going to eliminate all parking on both sides of Packard Street in the school block so that a right turn / U-turn queuing lane can be established to reduce traffic congestion. The Larrakeyah Primary School board is extremely concerned for the safety of parents and students if this measure is implemented as it requires pedestrians to negotiate two lines of traffic moving in opposite directions that are separated by a third lane of quasi stationary queuing vehicles. The solution appears to prioritise traffic flow and the amenity of Larrakeyah Terrace over pedestrian safety and student access considerations.

The City of Darwin did engage Tonkin Consulting Pty Ltd to provide a Road Safety Assessment which included recommendations on how to manage traffic for the remainder of the project. The School Board has identified and formally notified Tonkin Consulting of several issues with the analysis in this report, and does not have confidence in the proposed solution as either being safe or fit for purpose. The responses received from both the City of Darwin and Tonkin Consulting to our formal letters of concern have been dismissive and appear to show no real appreciation of our concerns.

Ultimately, the responsibility for the street design for traffic and pedestrian safety on Packard Street rests with the City of Darwin, however the Board will continue to press for an outcome that prioritises the safety of students.

The Board is still endeavouring to obtain additional infrastructure to cater for increasing numbers of students. The school expects that student enrolments will continue to increase broadly in line with historical trends - the number of students currently enrolled at the school is still greater than it was at the same time last year despite the affect of COVID travel restrictions.

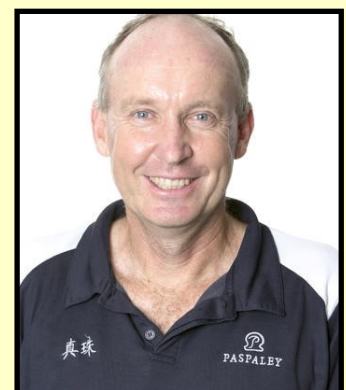
An update to the Preschool enrolment policy was also approved at the board meeting. This updated policy reinforces the applicability of the priority enrolment area to prospective Preschool students.

We are very fortunate in the Territory with the increased liberties that we enjoy in the new COVID normal compared to many other states and territories. One highlight for the school community is the resumption of parent attendance at school assemblies in a COVID safe manner. Please continue to be COVID safe and avoid complacency so that we can continue to enjoy these freedoms.
