Whilst the School Board focuses on the school's strategic direction, there are also several committees in which parents can become involved as well. We will be finalising subcommittees at the next Board meeting and providing further information. Last week we celebrated Harmony Day. All students participated in Harmony Day activities in class groups and had the opportunity to wear national costume or orange clothing. Harmony Day is a day to celebrate Australia's diversity and it was also wonderful to celebrate the diversity within our own school.

It is a concern that some children are arriving at school very early – some almost an hour before school commences. School commences at 8.15am. Parents need to be aware that supervision is provided from 8am.

School finishes at 2.45pm and parents are responsible for making arrangements for their child's supervision after school. If you are collecting your child from school, please be punctual. Office staff will follow up with parents if students are still waiting after the duty supervision at 3pm finishes in the afternoons. Students are not permitted to be playing in the school grounds when they are dismissed unless they are supervised by a parent.

The school sends information to families in regards to the Coronavirus that is distributed from the Department of Education. Please check notes sent home and also Skoolbag app. In addition, the school has always practised good hygiene and cleaning. Staff practise good hand hygiene and cough etiquette with students and we encourage families to do the same outside of school. Staff reinforce regular hand washing into daily routines in the classroom. There is thorough and regular cleaning of the school, including disinfecting commonly touched or frequently shared surfaces.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the outgoing board members Zeynep Yaltirakli, Jason Tutty (parent representatives) and Rachita Jain (teacher representative) for their contributions last year.

The objectives of the board are to:

- Focus on the strategic direction of the school
- Represent the school community in working to provide the best educational opportunities for students
- Represent the school community in the governance of the school while supporting the values and vision.

One of the projects that the board commenced last year was to engage Hully Liveris Design Company to update the school master plan. This was prompted by the school rapidly approaching classroom capacity, with an expectation that more classrooms will be required next year based on the historical growth of students. A focus of the master plan is to maintain as much open space as possible to provide a better environment for learning due the limited land parcel for the number of students. We expect this master plan to be finalised very shortly, at which point the board will be actively seeking funding from government for an additional classroom block, and additionally funding for a second Preschool classroom.

As parents, you can help this process by ensuring Territory politicians, including our local member Mr Paul Kirby, are hearing that having enough classrooms to meet expected demand at Larrakeyah Primary School is an issue that you feel strongly about. We believe that ensuring that all candidates for the

upcoming NT elections are hearing this message from parents can also help the cause.
