Dear Parents and Guardians,

Although there is the "Roadmap to the New Normal", the school will continue to implement the measures that we have in place this term for the safety of students and staff due to CODIV-19. Please read the information that has been sent home this week from the NT Department of Education .

We are still minimising the number of people moving in and out of the school grounds, particularly at drop off and pick up times, so please be aware of the following:

- We are requesting that parents "drop and go" if possible and reduce their time on school grounds. This means accessing Marella Street to "drop and go" or the front of the school drop off/pick up zone.
- To avoid groups of parents gathering and waiting outside classrooms, please drop your child at school and leave as quickly as possible.
- It is not always necessary to walk children all the way to the classroom. Maybe walk to the front of the school then children can walk themselves to the classroom.
- To avoid congestion outside classrooms, some parents who walk children to school have already organised with their child a place in the school to drop off/pick up ie. outside front office, outside library, Marella St walkway. This is a great idea for other parents to follow.
- Please do not enter classrooms.
- Ensure 1.5m distance between people.
- Parents and students are not to gather or play on playground equipment after school. Students dismissed from school are required to go home immediately.

Many thanks to parents who have put their own drop off/pick up measures in place which has been very helpful.

News from the School Board

Dear Parents and Carers,

The Board is very pleased to report that the new Master Plan for the school was approved at the board meeting on Monday afternoon with some slight amendments that have now being incorporated. Hully Liveris Design Company developed a plan that cleverly lays out the new infrastructure to maintain an open and conducive environment to learning despite a limited land parcel size. With this important project now complete, the Board is now able to focus on sourcing commitments to fund the necessary infrastructure.

The Board believes that Stage One of the Master Plan needs to be commenced directly as the school is rapidly approaching its capacity – in fact the Pre School has been unable to accommodate all children that wish to attend and live in the school's primary catchment area for a number of years now. Stage One consists of four new primary classrooms to replace the old lunch shed, and two new Pre School classrooms to replace the existing Pre School building.

As parents, you can assist our efforts to obtain funding for this infrastructure by talking with politicians and candidates in the upcoming NT election about the urgent need for funding to avoid compromises having to be made in the education of your children.

The OSHC program is being well supported by many families, with numbers gradually returning towards earlier numbers. The programs have been adapted to operate with appropriate COVID precautions and additional resources to safeguard the health of all participants.

Fortunately, life in the Territory is starting to return to some form of normality, however many people are significantly affected financially. If you are in a position to support local businesses, please do so. Businesses such as the Canteen which provide an important service to the school community are dependent on patronage to be able to operate and continue to employ people.

Please stay safe and look after your health.
