The International School Awards are hosted by <u>ISC Research</u> with the support of <u>International School Leader Magazine</u>. The gala awards evening is usually held in London but due to COVID, the event will be live-streamed January 18 2022 and the winners will be announced.

#### WHOLE SCHOOL STEAM DAY

On Friday 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021, Larrakeyah Primary School participated in a Whole School STEAM Day. We partnered with The Territory Wildlife Park, who provided real world problems for our students to solve. The problems were:

**Early Childhood Problem** -Design of a simple water play area that could be installed at the park. **Middle and Upper Problem** -Create ideas for dingo enrichment items.

We commenced the day with a presentation from a Territory Wildlife Park Ranger who posed the problems to our students. Following the presentation, we had a class vs class Breakout Box challenge, where students solved 4 problems to obtain the codes to unlock the locks on the boxes. Congratulations to 5 Spencer, 5/6 Mamouzellous Spruhan, 4 Dix, Transition Soltesz, T/1 Church and 1/2 Reynolds for breaking into the boxes. After recess, students began to ideate solutions to the problems and created prototypes using Mystery Bags (brown paper bag with 20 random items inside. Some items included were sticky tape, patty pans, pipe cleaners, paper cups and plates.) They then presented their ideas to their class, with a class winner decided. The class winner then presented to the Territory Wildlife Park after lunch via ZOOM. The day was a huge success with the Territory Wildlife Park mentioning that our students 'exceeded their expectations.' Our Local Member, Paul Kirby and the Education Minister, Lauren Moss visited some of our classes and spoke with our students about their solutions. This day encouraged the use of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills: Creativity, Critical Thinking, Collaboration and Communication.





## **News From the School Board**

Report from the School Board Chairperson.

The School Board would like to congratulate Fathma Mauger for winning the NT Principal of the Year and Danni Mattiazzo for winning the NT and Leader in Education Awards for the Darwin Region in the 2021 Teaching in the Territory Excellence Awards. The Board also recognises the achievement of Ashleigh Church as a finalist for Northern Territory Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Educator of the Year. These awards are a great recognition of the dedication and performance of both the recipients of the awards and the whole school team. Once again, well done ③.

Traffic arrangements in Packard Street are scheduled to change again this weekend with the new base entrance opening and the return to two way traffic to Packard Street. The NO RIGHT TURN into the school carpark road rule will remain in place permanently as it is essential for the safety of pedestrians using the school crossing, and as it also significantly reduces congestion. Parents using the "Kiss and Go" drop off will need to either continue to drive along Packard Street and use the new roundabout located inside the base to perform a U turn, or alternatively continue to use Larrakeyah Terrace and Murray Street to approach the school carpark from the west. The only safe and legal way to enter the school carpark is a left hand turn from Packard Street.

For parents using Marella Street to drop off children, please ensure that you pull over to the correct and safer left hand side of the road when dropping off and collecting children. If you enter Marella Street so that you can pull over to the school side of the road (ie travelling northbound from the Packard Street end towards the Temira Crescent end) this safer (and legal) disembarkation practice will naturally occur. Please be courteous and patient for the safety of everyone.

Larrakeyah Primary School has been shortlisted in the Pathways to Continued and University Education Category in the 2022 International School Awards by for the school's QUEST program. Shortlisting in these prestigious awards hosted by ISC Research is a tremendous achievement in itself – out of hundreds of international schools there were only two schools shortlisted in this Category last year – the British International School, Abu Dhabi and the English International College, Spain. This is great recognition of the special programs which the school operates – not only just QUEST, but the Whole School STEAM days and the Cooking and Gardening Program, all of which are preparing students for life after school. The Pathways to Continued and University Education Category is sponsored by National Geographic, with the event to be live streamed this year on the 18<sup>th</sup> January due to COVID instead of the normal Gala Event in London.

Construction of the new Covered Outdoor Learning Area is very near completion. We are looking forward to the hand over which is scheduled for the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December. The school board has funded this resource to ensure that school can continue to operate the signature programs of the school as student numbers increase.

We have had very good feedback from the school about how parents and students have coped with and accommodated the requirements specified by the government in relation to the recent COVID cases in the Northern Territory. Once again, we have been very fortunate that the consequences of these cases have had an extremely minor effect on the education of our children. Please continue to be COVID aware and engage in practices that reduce the chances of being affect both individually and as a community.


# CHANGE TO TRAFFIC CONDITIONS ON PACKARD STREET


