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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Guardians,

On Friday 23 April, we held our special ANZAC Assembly. It was great to see many parents attending. Thank you to our school captains, Nathan Ware and Nina Dyer for hosting the Assembly. Thank you to Jodie Murdoch (DSTA) and Brad King for organising the Assembly. A special thank you to our quest speaker. Wina Commander Andrew Anthony. His speech about the ANZAC spirit was excellent and very appropriate for the student age group. Thank you to Major Jason Perrins for his role in reading The Ode during the ANZAC Assembly. Nicholas Back did a great job raising the flag. For the first time, we had a Year 6 student, Peter Harvey, perform the Last Post and Rouse on his trumpet. We were very proud of Peter as his trumpet pieces were extremely well performed. Thank you also to Mrs Chin and our music students for playing the national anthem. The ANZAC Assembly was lovely and we received many positive comments.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual assessment program for schools since 2008. From next Tuesday 11 May, students will undertake the 2021 NAPLAN tests. NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four domains of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how individual students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australian children.

A reminder.... On Friday 4th June 2021, teachers will be involved in professional development sessions based on the focus areas of improvement in the school's Annual School Improvement Plan 2021. Sessions will be focussed on Writing, Data, Assessment and curriculum integration.

Teachers learning and working collaboratively to meet specific targets in the strategic plan will ensure that the school continues to move forward as well as build on the areas identified in the Teaching and Learning Improvement Framework outlined in the 2020 school review. 


