

FIRST Lego League Challenge

Larrakeyah Primary School recently entered two teams of year 6 students in the Top End round of the FIRST Lego League Challenge. FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) helps to fund programs that engage students in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics). The Lego League Challenge is judged on four different areas

Robot design.

• The robot game – a series of challenges to solve with a Lego robot in 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes.

Innovation project – designing a solution to a problem related to the theme
of the competition – this year's theme was Submerged, with a focus on the
ocean.

• Core values – teamwork, discovery, inclusion, innovation, impact, and fun. Both teams did well with their robot design and the robot game, bringing two trophies back to school.

Team Larrakeyah 1 won the Engineering Excellence Award which recognises efficient robot design, an innovative project solution, and evidence of the Core Values.

Team Larrakeyah 2 won the Robot Performance Award for scoring the most points during the robot game. They scored 150 points in the first round of the day, a score that remained unmatched throughout all 3 rounds of competition. The head referee commented that coming into the tournament, she thought that the benchmark score for the tournament would be about 150. This was because all the teams were rookie teams, so was impressed when our team had such a good run straight up. It was a reflection on the time they had spent meticulously coding and testing their robot in the lead up to the competition.

Whilst we didn't win the outright Champion's Award, the students should be

EVERYONE CAN PLAY!

The Northern Territory Music School invites you to apply for your child's enrolment in our instrumental and choir programs for 2025.

Who are we?

The NT Music School is a division of the NT Department of Education that offers instrumental, ensemble and choir tuition in government schools.

What are the benefits?

Learning to play a musical instrument and singing in a choir can have both academic and social benefits, as well as being rewarding and enjoyable. We invite your child to begin their musical journey with us.

How does it work?

Application to enrol is offered to students from Year 4 in primary school and to students in middle school. Students come out of class once a week for a 30 minute instrumental lesson with an NT Music School teacher. Students play and practise at home to learn instrument technique, music reading and performance skills. Our choir program is offered by audition. Successful students attend weekly choir rehearsals after school.

What does the program offer?

Students can join a guitar ensemble or join our bass guitar, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, and percussion lessons. They will also have the opportunity to participate in school performances and access events such as the BEAT Festival!

What will it cost?

Lessons are free. Once enrolment is confirmed, an annual contribution of \$100 is requested. Instruments can be hired for a semester from \$100. Sports Vouchers are accepted to assist with the cost of hiring instruments. Students are required to purchase a tutor book from \$25.

How can I apply?





To alleviate the heavy traffic congestion during school drop off and pick up times, we request that all parents adhere to the following guidelines. A diagram has been provided for your convenience.


These guidelines are of utmost importance to ensure the smooth operation of the Larrakeyah Defence Precinct and allow unobstructed access for our ADF members and emergency services. Importantly, compliance is crucial to maximise safety.

DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE (GREEN)

The paved road indicates the boundary of Commonwealth Property. Defence has generously provided access to parking bays for parents to easily drop off and collect their children from school.

EXISTING KISS AND GO ZONE (FRONT OF LPS)

Access to this area is via Larrakeyah Terrace, as indicated by signage. Please note that there is NO RIGHT TURN into the school from Packard Street.



BASE ROUNDABOUT

Parking or standing on the roundabout is strictly prohibited, and the roundabout is not to be used as a U-turn point.
