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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Guardians.

Larrakeyah Primary has an explicit school improvement agenda based on high quality teaching to improve learning outcomes for all students. The annual school improvement plan has a particular focus this year on Mathematics and Wellbeing.

Our data has shown that students are experiencing difficulty with problem solving and place value. We need a consistent approach in teaching Mathematics across the school. On Friday 19 April all staff were involved in Mathematics professional development day with an external consultant presenting sessions on 'Learning Through Doing'. 'Learning Through Doing' is a teaching approach which enables teachers to sequence Mathematics lessons, use identified strategies and manipulative materials to develop an understanding of concepts. Our teachers will work in their teams to

plan Mathematics programs based on 'Learning Through Doing'.

Last Wednesday 24 April, we held our special ANZAC Assembly. It was great to see many parents attending. Thank you to our school captains, Nathan and Halle for hosting the Assembly. Thank you to Jodie Murdoch (DSM) for her organisation. A special thank you to our guest speaker, Lieutenant Colonel Day. His speech about the story of Gallipoli was excellent and related so well to our school values. Thank you to Captain David Shirvington for his role in reading The Ode during the ANZAC Assembly. Thank you to Captain Tristan Hedger for raising the flag and Able Seaman Chris Ellis who played The Last Post and The Rouse . Able Seaman Leigh Robke joined our singing group to perform 'We Are Australian' with support from Mrs Gaisford. The ANZAC Assembly was lovely and we received many positive

comments.

The NT Teaching in the Territory Awards are now open and close 24th May. We are fortunate to have excellent staff at Larrakeyah Primary who are worthy to be nominated for these awards. 





To alleviate the heavy traffic congestion during school drop off and pick up times, we request that all parents adhere to the following guidelines. A diagram has been provided for your convenience.



DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE (GREEN)

The paved road indicates the boundary of Commonwealth Property. Defence has generously provided access to parking bays for parents to easily drop off and collect their children from school.

EXISTING KISS AND GO ZONE (FRONT OF LPS)

Access to this area is via Larrakeyah Terrace, as indicated by signage. Please note that there is NO RIGHT TURN into the school from Packard Street.



BASE ROUNDABOUT

Parking or standing on the roundabout is strictly prohibited, and the roundabout is not to be used as a U-turn point.
