FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Given the international recognition and the success of the QUEST programme in upper primary (Years 5 & 6), a new programme called ASPIRE was introduced last year to students in Years T-4. ASPIRE exposes students to inquiry-based learning and working with industry professional leading to the QUEST program.

In ASPIRE, teachers plan and implement an inquiry project using 21st century learning skills (communication, collaboration, creativity and critical thinking) and involving an industry professional. Students from the same year level learn beyond the classroom and work on the inquiry project with an industry professional. An example of an inquiry question and project this year is, "At times, people are separated for long periods of time. How can we create a moving toy to communicate with them across time and space?"

Like QUEST, ASPIRE culminates in an Expo of Learning. Well done to our EC students for sharing their learning with parents, staff, students, industry professionals and community members in the ASPIRE Expo. It was an impressive showcase of learning and the 21st century skills involved - 4C's Communication, Collaboration, Creativity and Critical Thinking.

Larrakeyah Primary is recognised for its

innovative programs that inspire students and develop the important skills that students will require in the future.

The school is proud to be the state winner of the Anzac Day School Award. A huge thank you to Jodie Murdoch for coordinating the school's entry as so much work goes into any nomination. Thank you to all who contributed to this award.

Our students have returned from the Year 6 international study tour to Singapore. They had an amazing time and also visited our partner school, Invictus International School. Thank you to Mr King, Mrs Spruhan, Mrs Vrettis, Mr Mamouzellos and Mr France for accepting the huge responsibility of supervising and caring for students overseas. Teachers do not receive any additional pay outside their normal work hours and this trip involved 24/7 care for almost one week, including a Saturday. We are fortunate to have teachers who volunteer their time to provide wonderful opportunities for our students.

We look forward to seeing everyone at our concert next Thursday 19 September 7pm at the Darwin Entertainment Centre (DEC). Information will be sent home so you are aware of where students need to meet their teacher at DEC, arrival times and other requirements.

Seats are sold out downstairs at DEC and

only a few tickets remain upstairs. Tickets can be purchased either online www.yourcentre.com.au or from the DEC Box Office. \$30 adult and \$15 child or concession holders. There is no charge for Larrakeyah Primary students who will be performing. As the concert is "out of normal school hours," Larrakeyah Primary students can only attend if they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Any Larrakeyah Primary students attending who are not participating in the Concert must be seated with their parents and a ticket needs to be purchased for them.

To help set the mood for the concert, we encourage all parents and friends attending to come dressed for a night of glitz and glamour, ready to walk on the red carpet. We look forward to seeing our school community dressed in formal attire at "A Night At The Oscars". It promises to be a wonderful evening.

After a few weeks break. students resume school on Tuesday 8th October.



Please contact one of our Assistant Principals should you need to discuss this.


Items and Valuables at School

LARRAKEYAH DEFENCE PRECINCT School Drop Off / Pick Up BASE ENTRY

MIND THE RULES, FOLLOW SIGNS AND SIGNALS.

To alleviate the heavy traffic congestion during school drop off and pick up times, we request that all parents adhere to the following guidelines. A diagram has been provided for your convenience.

These guidelines are of utmost importance to ensure the smooth operation of the Larrakeyah Defence Precinct and allow unobstructed access for our ADF members and emergency services. Importantly, compliance is crucial to maximise safety.

DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE (GREEN)

The paved road indicates the boundary of Commonwealth Property. Defence has generously provided access to parking bays for parents to easily drop off and collect their children from school.

EXISTING KISS AND GO ZONE (FRONT OF LPS)

Access to this area is via Larrakeyah Terrace, as indicated by signage. Please note that there is NO RIGHT TURN into the school from Packard Street.



BASE ROUNDABOUT

Parking or standing on the roundabout is strictly prohibited, and the roundabout is not to be used as a U-turn point.
