From the Board

Hello Larrakeyah School Community,

Who is tired? C'mon, hands up...... me too. But whilst the 'busy' seems to ramp up in December, so does the opportunity for reflection. Sitting here reflecting on 'the year that was' at LPS, my heart is full and I know that we have set ourselves up well to deliver a strong 2026.

This year saw the return of the flagship events on our school calendar - school camps, Aspire, Quest, our extra curricular activities, our school sports carnival, Halloween disco and of course, our sell-out performance - Moana.

We were also able to add new experiences and successes in 2025. I'd like to thank fellow Board members, Nicho Peters and Riley France, for introducing LPS into the interschool AFL program in Term 3. Additionally, we saw the return of swimming lessons offered through LPS at the start of Term 4. I'd also like to congratulate our Tournament of the Minds team that travelled interstate to represent our school; a truly fantastic achievement and experience for all students involved.

Academically, the school has reached new heights and is a clear leader in innovation, not just in the Territory, but on the national stage. Earlier this year, we won the Best Use of Technology Award at the Australian Education Awards for IntelliLearn, a concept developed and designed entirely in-house at LPS and used in our classrooms. We have also been recognised in the media today for our exceptional performance and growth in NAPLAN results. These results are a testament to our innovation and excellence in leadership, our courage to explore new things and be informed by data, and they come to life through an incredibly talented team of dedicated teachers. Thankyou to all at LPS who have made these things possible in 2025 - we are truly best to have the Territory's leading educators at our school!

As parents will be aware, the Board has been working hard to drive improvement in our OSHC services for some time now. With increasing regulation and complexity in the sector, the Board has taken the decision to transition delivery of our OSHC service to a specialist provider, Camp Australia. This transition will occur over the end-of-year school holidays, with families that require OSHC over the holidays able to attend alternate Camp Australia sites. Camp Australia will be ready to commence operation of our LPS OSHC at the start of Term 1, 2026. The Board took this decision to ensure sustainable, high-quality delivery of OSHC services to our LPS community, and we thank you all for working with us through the transition period.

In 2026, our Annual School Improvement Plan highlights continued focus on numeracy and wellbeing, and literacy returns as a third key focus area. Additionally, the Board will continue to focus on OSHC performance and safety around the school drop-off and pick-up areas. We are currently working with NT Police to explore how we can further deter and reduce activities that place our students at risk in times of peak movement.

Moving into 2026, may I please remind families of the school's annual voluntary contribution of \$150 per child. These contributions allow the school to deliver a range of benefits to enhance our childrens' experience at LPS, Darwin Entertainment Centre venue for the school concert, subsidising ECA Community engagement activities, additional equipment for students at recess and lunch, additional technology in classrooms and upgrades to student playground areas. It would be great to continue to deliver these important enhancements to the learning experience.

Lastly, I would like to wish our Year 6's and families leaving us this year well on the next stage of their journeys. We hope you carry fond memories of LPS with you always.

Merry Christmas to all, enjoy the holiday period with family - especially those precious little people who are growing way too fast! See you all in 2026.












REMINDER TO PARENTS - NO RIGHT HAND TURN INTO THE SCHOOL
