As per the uniform policy, leggings or bike pants are additional items and as such do not replace the shorts/ skorts. They can be worn underneath skorts, shorts or the dress. Parents can use the \$200 government school voucher to purchase uniforms. Thank you to parents who have been most proactive and supportive in ensuring that children are wearing full school uniform to school everyday.



Please do not drop or send your child to school before 7:50am as we are not able to provide supervision. As always, the safety of your child is our priority.



How long have you been a part of the Larrakeyah Primary School community?


I began working at Larrakeyah Primary School at the start of 2024!



PERMISSION TO ATTEND DARWIN REGION TRIALS 12 Years & Under Cricket

Primary & Middle School Students – Boys & Girls
Students born between 1st of July 2012 – 31st of December 2015.

Age dispensation applies for students born 1st of July – 31st of December 2012.

You are invited to attend the 2025 12 Years & under Cricket Selection Trials for Darwin Region.

To be eligible for selection in the Darwin Region Team students <u>MUST</u> attend a minimum of 2 of the 3 trial days, be the correct age and attend a Darwin Region School. Selectors will identify the students that will make up the Darwin Region Team and reserve members. Students will be selected based on their ability to meet game specific criteria and participate as a team member. Students are encouraged to attend all of the 3 days to give themselves the best opportunity for selection. Results will be communicated via email within 5 business days with those selected receiving a Darwin Region Team Member/Reserve Booklet and invoice to follow. Darwin Region aims to take 1 Boys and 1 Girls team to the School of Sport Education NT Event being held in Darwin 3rd – 5th June 2025.

If you are selected for the Darwin Region, either as a team member or a reserve, it is expected that you will attend all trainings, hand in all paperwork and make all levy payments by the due dates.

Booklet paperwork (permission forms with principal and parent signature) is due back to the Team Manager/Darwin Region on the 3rd of April. Levy cost will be approximately \$490 with an initial \$100 deposit being due on the 16th of April and remaining amount due on the 8th of May. Failure to meet these requirements may result in the student losing their position.

If the student is unable to attend a training session please contact the team manager/coach prior to training.

School of Sport Education NT will be selecting a NT Team to compete in the School Sport Australia Championships in Ballarat, VICTORIA, 25th – 31st October 2025.

<u>IMPORTANT:</u> Trial permission forms are preferred to be received via email to <u>darwinsport.doe@education.nt.gov.au</u> prior to the trials commencing. Once received a response will be emailed and a registration number will be issued, this number is requested to be remembered for trials.

MIND THE RULES, FOLLOW SIGNS AND SIGNALS.

To alleviate the heavy traffic congestion during school drop off and pick up times, we request that all parents adhere to the following guidelines. A diagram has been provided for your convenience.

These guidelines are of utmost importance to ensure the smooth operation of the Larrakeyah Defence Precinct and allow unobstructed access for our ADF members and emergency services. Importantly, compliance is crucial to maximise safety.

DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE (GREEN)

The paved road indicates the boundary of Commonwealth Property. Defence has generously provided access to parking bays for parents to easily drop off and collect their children from school.

EXISTING KISS AND GO ZONE (FRONT OF LPS)

Access to this area is via Larrakeyah Terrace, as indicated by signage. Please note that there is NO RIGHT TURN into the school from Packard Street.



BASE ROUNDABOUT

Parking or standing on the roundabout is strictly prohibited, and the roundabout is not to be used as a U-turn point.
