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## **FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome all to Term 2. Last term we said farewell to teachers Biddy Miller who returned to Sydney and Tamieka Fernance who is now travelling overseas. We welcome back teachers Caroline Gangotena and Emma Loughran who have returned to Larrakevah Primary.

On Monday staff had a professional development day combined with Moil Primary, Wulagi Primary and Stuart Park Primary. All schools involved have a focus on Mathematics in their Annual School Improvement Plan (ASIP). An external consultant, Guy Constable, presented "Learning Through Doing". "Learning Through Doing" is a comprehensive Mathematics program that is now in place from Transition through to Year 6. The program aligns with our school's emphasis on hands-on learning. The program supports teaching and learning in all areas of Mathematics: number and algebra, measurement and geometry, and data and statistics. Learning Through Doing makes Mathematics engaging and supports teachers to differentiate their approach to match what students need.

A number of students travel to and from school using public transport. The school has previously raised concerns regarding overcrowding of buses and primary school students having to stand in buses which resulted in solutions offered by the Department of Infrastructure,

Planning and Logistics. It is also important for parents to provide feedback, particularly if there are concerns regarding student behaviour on buses or other safety issues. The link is <u>https://dli.nt.gov.au/</u> feedback

A reminder... The wearing of full school uniform has been inconsistent in the past with a noticeable number of students wearing alternative clothing with the school shirt. 

# LARRAKEYAH DEFENCE PRECINCT School Drop Off / Pick Up BASE ENTRY

#### MIND THE RULES, FOLLOW SIGNS AND SIGNALS.

To alleviate the heavy traffic congestion during school drop off and pick up times, we request that all parents adhere to the following guidelines. A diagram has been provided for your convenience.

These guidelines are of utmost importance to ensure the smooth operation of the Larrakeyah Defence Precinct and allow unobstructed access for our ADF members and emergency services. Importantly, compliance is crucial to maximise safety.

#### DROP OFF / PICK UP ZONE (GREEN)

The paved road indicates the boundary of Commonwealth Property. Defence has generously provided access to parking bays for parents to easily drop off and collect their children from school.

#### EXISTING KISS AND GO ZONE (FRONT OF LPS)

Access to this area is via Larrakeyah Terrace, as indicated by signage. Please note that there is NO RIGHT TURN into the school from Packard Street.



#### **BASE ROUNDABOUT**

Parking or standing on the roundabout is strictly prohibited, and the roundabout is not to be used as a U-turn point.
