We were proud to be finalists in 5 categories. Assistant Principal of the Year – Danni Mattiazzo, Principal of the Year Government- Fathma Mauger, Primary School of the Year Government -Larrrakeyah Primary School, Best Wellbeing Program - Larrrakeyah Primary School and Best Use of Technology -Larrrakeyah Primary School.

Larrakeyah Primary won the Best Use of **Technology award.** The school has been a finalist in this category for the past two years so it was exciting to finally win this award. Our nomination focussed on our custom built AI 'IntelliLearn' that we use to improve Writing in upper primary. 


ABSENCES

Please do not drop or send your child to school before 7:50am as we are not able to provide supervision. As always, the safety of your child is our priority.






What is one lesson or activity you love to teach, and why do you think it resonates with the students?






