FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Larrakeyah Primary School recently competed in Tournament of Minds (TOM). TOM is an academic competition focusing on collaborative problem solving and critical thinking. Students work in a team to create a dramatic performance outlining their solution to an open-ended Long Term challenge in one of four disciplines: STEM, Language Literature, The Arts and Social Science. Students also participate in a shorter, unseen Spontaneous Challenge on the day of the Tournament. The school entered 3 teams, LarraKids (Social Sciences), Ink and Imagination (The Arts) and LPS MasterMinds (STEM). All 3 teams represented the school proudly and produced wonderful final presentations that were all commended by the judges. We are excited to announce that our Ink and Imagination Team won The Arts category! Well done on an amazing achievement!

Our Years T-4 students have been involved in the ASPIRE program. ASPIRE exposes students to inquiry-based learning and working with industry professional leading to the QUEST program. In ASPIRE, teachers plan and implement an inquiry project using 21st century learning skills (communication, collaboration, creativity and critical thinking) and involving an industry professional. Students from the same year level learn beyond the classroom and work on the inquiry project with an industry professional.

Like QUEST, ASPIRE culminates in an Expo of Learnina. Well done to our EC students for sharing their learning with parents, staff, students, industry professionals and community members in the ASPIRE Expo. It was a wonderful showcase of learning and the 21st century skills involved. Larrakeyah Primary is recognised for its innovative programs that inspire students and develop the important skills that students will require in the future.

Our students have returned from the Year 6 international study tour to Singapore. They had an amazing time and also visited our partner school, Invictus International School. Thank you

to Mr King, Mr France, Ms Goodear, Ms Carswell, Mr Mamouzellos and Ms Gerlach for accepting the huge responsibility of supervising and caring for students overseas. Teachers do not receive any additional pay outside their normal work hours and this trip involved 24/7 care for almost one week, including a Saturday. We are fortunate to have teachers who volunteer their time to provide wonderful opportunities for our students.

We look forward to seeing everyone at our school production "Moana" next Wednesday 17 September 7pm at the Darwin Entertainment Centre (DEC). Information will be sent home so you are aware of where students need to meet their teacher at DEC, arrival times and other

Seats are almost sold out with only a few tickets remaining. Tickets can be purchased either online www.yourcentre.com.au or from the DEC Box Office. \$30 adult and \$15 child or concession holders. There is no charge for Larrakeyah Primary students who will be performing. As the concert is "out of normal school hours," Larrakeyah Primary students can only attend if they are accompanied by a parent or guardian. Any Larrakeyah Primary students attending who are not participating in the Production must be seated with their parents and a ticket needs to be purchased for

To help set the mood for "Moana", we encourage all parents and friends attending to come dressed in tropical prints, Hawaiian shirts or outfits that reflect the tropical Hawaiian theme. We look forward to seeing our school community dressed for "Moana" and it promises to be a wonderful evening.

I have been part of Larrakeyah Primary School for over eight years and have 16 years of experience working in Territory schools.


What is one part of your role that you really enjoy, and why do you think it makes a difference to the students or school?







SCHOOL BUS TRAVEL

Please take note of the bus routes in the links below and speak to your child about the best bus for them to catch. Bus 103 can become quite congested in the afternoon with some students unable to get on due to numbers. Bus 209 is an alternative option for some of our students, especially those who live in Bayview.
