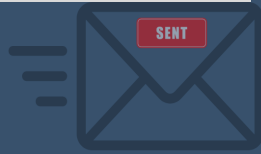

# Territory Day

The Minister for Education and Training announced the launch of the new Territory Day in Schools initiative, a multi-year initiative that will support schools and students across the Northern Territory to explore and celebrate what it means to be a Territorian through learning and creativity.

The initiative is intended to establish Territory Day as an annual anchor point for whole-school learning, celebration and reflection, while supporting schools to champion the Territory as a vibrant and inclusive place to grow up and call home. It will continue over the next three years, leading into the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Northern Territory self-government in 2028, with annual themes designed to support ongoing engagement and exploration of Territory identity, place, history and community.

The 2026 theme is Identity – what does Territory Day mean to me?

Next week, our students will engage in activities that will encourage them to reflect on their connection to their community, culture and the Territory, and explore what belonging means to them as young Territorians.

### **How long have you been a part of the Larrakeyah Primary School community?**

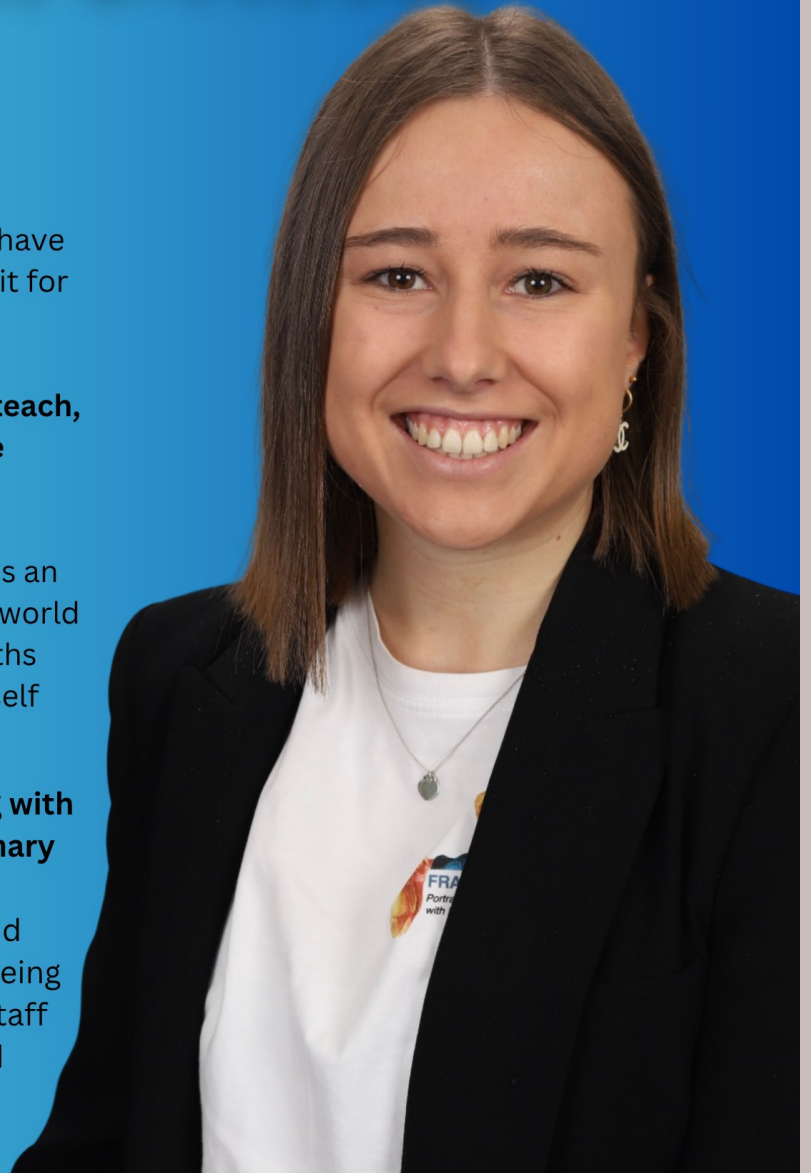
This is my 1st year being a part of the LPS community. After moving from Adelaide, I have enjoyed every single moment and can't wait for more!



# SCHOOL REPORTS

On Wednesday 17th of June (Week 10), school reports will be sent home.

A – E grades show learning against your child's current year level achievement standard.  
The grades awarded on this report are based on demonstration of:

- A outstanding achievement
- B high achievement
- C sound achievement
- D limited achievement
- E very limited achievement

## A - E grading outlines academic ability.

**C grade** means that your child is **at** their expected level.

**A or B grade** means your child is achieving **above** expected level.

**D or E grade** means your child is achieving **below** expected level.

**Effort** describes how well your child applies themselves to their school work.  
The ratings are:

- Excellent
- Very Good
- Satisfactory
- Needs Improvement

It is important to take note of the effort level awarded to your child. This determines how they apply themselves to lessons. A child can be above in their academic ability and only receive a Satisfactory or Needs Improvement Effort, this may mean they do not try as hard as they could or that they may not apply themselves consistently to lessons. On the other hand, a child may be below level with their grade and achieve an Excellent Effort Level. This means they try really hard and put forth their best efforts always. **This is something to celebrate.**

If your child is going to receive a D or E grade on their report, this should not be a surprise to you. Our teachers should have already flagged their concerns with you and will follow up with a phone call once they have confirmed your child's grade allocation.

Finally, a next step comment will be at the bottom of the English and Mathematics comment. This is something that your child can work on at home and at school to help them improve in this area.

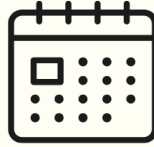

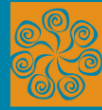

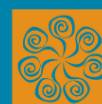

# NO MOBILE PHONES OR PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES



Students in Northern Territory Government Schools are not permitted to use mobile phones or personal digital devices during the school day, including break times. This requirement reduces distractions and disruptions to learning, encourages social interaction and physical activity, and helps to create a safe environment free from cyberbullying and online content.

This means that students are not permitted to have mobile phones or digital devices in their possession during the school day. Phones need to be handed in to the class teacher at the start of the day.

Breaches of this policy will result in phones being confiscated from students.

Thank you for your support in reinforcing this expectation.

## NO TOYS AND VALUABLES

Please note that we kindly ask families to avoid sending students to school with toys or valuable items, including smart watches, as these can easily be misplaced or damaged during the school day.

Any items brought to school remain the responsibility of the student, and the school is unable to accept responsibility for items that are lost or damaged.
